ATTENTION Faculty Advisors: The sequences outlined below are for your general knowledge. Specific MATH and ENGLISH requirements vary by Degree Program.

You <u>must</u> consult the degree requirements on the backside of this worksheet to learn the specific MATH & ENGLISH requirements for this degree program.

MATH, ENGLISH & ESL SEQUENCES (not degree specific):

Some students will require developmental Math, English or ESL work depending on test scores and placement. Placement information is available on your Degree Requirement Checklist (DRC), or by speaking with an advisor.

Below are the typical sequences for Math, English (for English dominant students), and ESL (English as a Second Language). Students would begin at their placement level and progress from there, dependent upon their specific degree program.

Math: MAT 1604 \rightarrow MAT 1622 (**RETEST**) \rightarrow MAT 1624 \rightarrow MATH General Education Requirements.

English (for English Dominant students): ENG 1301 and ENG 1399 (usually taken concurrently depending on placement results) (RETEST) → English General Education Requirements.

English as a Second Language: ESL 1315 (2.5 cr.) \rightarrow ESL 1320 (2.5 cr.) \rightarrow ESL 025 (2 cr.) <u>and</u> ESL 026 or ESL 027 (1 cr.) \rightarrow ESL 035 (2 cr.) <u>and</u> ESL 036 or ESL 037 (1 cr.) \rightarrow ENG 1300 (3 cr.) \rightarrow ENG 1396 (1 cr.) (RETEST) \rightarrow English General Education Requirements.

ESL sequence revised beginning Fall 2004: ESL 015 & 016 (4 cr.) \rightarrow ESL 025 (2 cr.) <u>and</u> ESL 026 or ESL 027 (1 cr.) \rightarrow ESL 035 (2 cr.) <u>and</u> ESL 036 or ESL 037 (1 cr.) \rightarrow ENG 1300 (3 cr.) \rightarrow ENG 1396 (1 cr.) **(RETEST)** \rightarrow English General Education Requirements.

Pass the ACT Reading and
Writing exams.
Pass the CUNY MATHexam.
Pass the CUNY Proficiency Exam (CPE)
between the 45 th and 60 th credit. Only students who have
passed the CUNY ACT tests in Reading and Writing are
eligible to take the CPE.
Complete 2 Writing Intensive (WI) Sections.
Effective with the Spring 2000 entering class, students are
required to have 16 CPI units for graduation. If you have not
had your CPI units determined, contact Academic
Achievement Office (D-101 C) at (718) 518-4487.
Maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA).
