## **POSITION DETAILS**

The Accessibility Resource Center at Hostos Community College serves students with disabilities to gain the support and accommodations they need to be successful in college and beyond. In addition to accommodations, students will have the opportunity to participate in workshops and other learning experiences, engage in campus activities and be exposed to leadership opportunities at Hostos, in CUNY, and in the community.

Reporting directly to the Accessibility Resource Center Director, the successful candidate will be responsible but not limited to the following:

- Coordinate reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities in accordance with ADA and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and recent ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAAA) such as note takers, readers, scribes, sign language interpreters, and other services as needed.
- Conducts intake assessments and reviews documentation in consultation with the Director of the Accessibility Resource Center.
- Provides general referral information of assistive technology appropriate for students based on individual disability/academic records.
- Assists students in understanding their disabilities to discuss academic and personal concerns related to disability.
- Provides information, referral, ad support to prospective and enrolled students with disabilities.
- Tracks services and assesses program outcomes.
- Coordinates campus outreach activities and special events such as CUNY's designated Disability Awareness month in April.
- Manages marketing and recruitment efforts for the Accessibility Resource Center events and promotions.
- Promotes student awareness of pertinent events within and outside the college via e-mail and print communications.
