

College-wide Commitments: AY21-22

Assessment

- Systematize assessment to ensure effectiveness of degree programs and support systems to help students learn and achieve career and transfer success.
- Use environmental scan to inform revision of some programs and creation of programs to ensure access is tied to career and transfer opportunities.

Communication –

- Advocate on behalf of our students at receiving baccalaureate institutions.
- Ensure that degree maps and other student resources are as helpful as they can be.

Community Engagement –

- Grow and strengthen community advisory boards to link programs to jobs and increase educational opportunities that are tied to employment.
- Partner with Hostos Community Advisory Council and build on the five Spr21 roundtables to benefit students (Fa21 implementation)

Professional Development –

• Encourage and support faculty and staff research and increase culture of grant writing by engaging the Committee on Sponsored Programs and Grants.

Systems Alignment –

- Let intentionality be at the fore of onboarding, evaluating prior learning for credit, and progress from orientation to advisement.
- Map out all components that contribute to student transfer, with an emphasis on frequent touchpoints and assessment of progress; grow stackable credentials across all levels of credential/degree attainment.

AY21-22 — OP Template/Technical information

- The OP is in Excel, on Microsoft Teams.
- Each division has their own worksheet. There is an additional worksheet for college-wide committees.
- Activities are informed by the college-wide annual assessment process (called A-PART for short). There will be additional Activities that align the President's priorities.
- Alignment the SP cross-cutting commitments (Assessment, Communication, Community Engagement, Professional Development, and Systems Alignment) and college-wide priorities identified at the President's Planning Retreat in late April.
- There will be three Progress Updates (December, March, May) shared with the college community.





Timeline/Key Dates

- Apr 28 & 29 President's Retreat
- July/Aug Division leadership reviewed A-PARTs with department/unit leaders, review recommendations through lens of college-wide priorities and available resources
- August 18 President's Post Retreat
- August 20 Divisions (after reviewing department/unit A-PARTs) draft OP activities in Excel worksheet (Teams site)
- August 30 Preliminary review, prep for President and Cabinet
- Sept 21 OP draft shared with college community; solicit feedback
- Sept 28 Incorporate President/Cabinet final revisions
- Sept 30 Final OP shared with campus in advance of the President's All-College Meeting

An email will go out to the college from the President's Office with an attachment: the draft AY21-22 Operational Plan

My email will be included in the body of the narrative, inviting you to submit comments/questions/suggestions about the draft

Any input will be integrated by September 28th, when the President and Cabinet will review the final version of the AY21-22 OP

On September 30th, the final version will be posted online (OIERA website) and an email will be sent to the college community with a link. Progress updates will be posted three times a year
