2013-2014 Highlights

- 136 students received career-focused academic and English language skills instruction, occupational training and other related services via CUNY CareerPATH Program.
- As of spring 2014, we provided Allied Health career services to 539 students as a result of a Health Professions Opportunity Grant Program. Of the 539 participants, 518 completed certificate programs.
- As a result of providing services to 150 veterans and enrolling 80 in our programs, we were awarded a two-year \$300,000 grant from the Stavros Niarchos Foundation to better serve veterans through case management and support services.
- In the fall, in partnership with Montefiore Health System and Phipps Neighborhoods, we will serve additional students with career services through a \$1,000,000 JP Morgan Chase grant.
- Through our partnership with Jewish Home Lifecare, 21 high school seniors earned a total of 80 certifications including Certified Nursing Assistant, CPR, EKG, Phlebotomy and Patient Care Technician.
- To date, our Jobs-Plus Program provided 540 residents of Jefferson Houses in East Harlem with social, financial and employment counseling services. Of the 540 residents, 153 secured job placements.
- Working in collaboration with the Center for Employment Opportunities, 150 formerlyincarcerated men and women successfully participated in an electrical and plumbing training program with a green emphasis leading to entry-level jobs in those trades.
- 30 students graduated from our free Farmer's Market Customer Service Training Program and are now candidates for employment at Harvest Home and GrowNYC—green/healthy living initiatives. The Program focuses on managerial responsibility, computer and accounting skills, verbal and non-verbal communication and defusing conflict.

CUNY Language Immersion Program (CLIP)

HOSTOS CLIP PROGRAM MOVING INTO A NEW HOME

The CUNY Language Immersion Program (CLIP) is moving into a new building at 590 Exterior Street (East 150th street between Exterior Street and River Avenue).



CLIP is an intensive ESL program, comprised of 25 hours of instruction each week, for entering freshmen who have already been admitted to a CUNY college. The program also accepts students who have failed one semester of ESL at a two-year CUNY college or those referred by a senior college.

The new location will serve approximately 450 students, including 275 CLIP students, 100 CUNY START students and 75 new students enrolled in the

new Hostos Community Language Program (CLP). CLP will offer three ESL classes for new language learners who are admitted to CUNY but who lack high-level English communication skills.

In addition to class instruction facilitated by experienced ESL instructors, this program utilizes volunteers who act as conversation partners. CLP students will also have access to computer-assisted learning and other support services. http://www.clip.cuny.edu/

NY START

CUNY START is an intensive 18-week program that offers both part-time and full-time classes in academic reading, writing and math for students who have not passed one or more of the CUNY placement tests.
